

# Garden Locations

## **1 E Front St** Pollinator Native Plant Ecosystem Garden @ Media-Upper Providence Library

**120 E Front St** This is a school garden created by the Garden Club of Media Elementary! It contains many native plants, as well as some fruits and vegetables. The garden is a long strip along the Front St. parking lot (near the playground) stretching from the shed to the front of the building. Additionally, on the Monroe Street side, a new circular shade garden featuring plants from Redbud Nursery is located; look for the blue bricks. The host had an unexpected event, and can't join - but please go check out the Club's great work!

## **102 W Baltimore Ave** Native Plant Memorial Garden.

**121 N Edgmont St** We are not your typical house with a manicured lawn and neat hedges. In fact, we have no lawn at all; we do have trees, shrubs, perennials, vegetables, herbs, and fruit all growing wildly and living harmoniously together. When we first moved in almost 27 years ago.

**215 E Third St.** The garden is along the street atop a stone wall, and another one is at the top of the driveway along the edge of the property.

**16 W Fourth St.** My front garden is approximately 125 square feet and planted entirely with native species. It is well-designed and cared for by an artist and an ecological gardener. This garden is a model for what can be done with small spaces to provide essential food and habitat.

**430 N Monroe St** Evergreen low-maintenance gardens around the perimeter of the property with accents of color in both annuals and perennials

## **417 N Orange St** Container Garden

**25 W Fourth St** Maximizing a small outdoor space for a personal man cave retreat. \*Otherwise known as: Freddym's Outdoor Bar and Grill.

**27 W Fourth St** An eclectic mix of old garden things (vintage junk look) and newer plantings. In the back is a secret garden with a sitting area.

## **115 W Fifth St** Native (with just a couple of non-native)

**130 E Fifth St** Small, mostly native garden, front & back of house. Also, vegetable gardens in the back.

**720 N Jackson St** Front yard display gardening for extensive walker and runner traffic. 130'- long side display garden. Rear privacy/ entertaining landscaping with 15 trees/bushes. 5-year-old landscape of the new property.

**801 N Jackson St** This garden is designed to attract and support wildlife, including songbirds, pollinators, and butterflies. We look forward to showcasing and discussing our plant choices with anyone who is interested.

**27 W Eighth St** Inside the white picket fence, we've got a happy front yard with a variety of flowers, shrubs, trees, garden art, & tiled window boxes. (Variety of native & non-native plants. Recent plantings are native, now that we understand the importance...)
